It has long been known that Fluoride is added to our water for the benefit of "our health" this is common knowledge and a simple sample survey of New Zealander's could provide abundant proof to this statement. More importantly it is also common knowledge that Fluoride is added to our water supply to help with our teeth.. i.e. Fluoride added to our common water supply is targeted at a particular area of public health. So it should be obvious that if this situation does not meet the definition of 'medicine' then this will ultimately allow the public to challenge the current 'health' industry and allow alternative treatments into the New Zealand market that are then not classified as 'medicines' using the same logic. The proposed double standard in New Zealand(NZ) law will cost far too much for the relative benefit gained.. so why do it?

3. The Medicines Act is designed to protect people from the risk of indiscriminate use of medicines, reflecting the ethical codes of health professionals to "first do no harm". Fluoride (in this vague definition of it) is found in very high amounts in common table salt in New Zealand, in fact the NZ population are currently getting high doses of Fluoride from their food supply right now, however the ministry of health has failed to

do the studies to confirm this, therefore the act of adding Fluoride to NZ common water supply is in grave error. In fact there are other supplies of Fluoride (like compounds) that the average or common New Zealander is exposed to that should be bought forward and facts should be presented to the public, assuming the ministry of health was following its mandate to educate the public against current health risks, i.e. the average New Zealander is already consuming too much fluoride right now.. but the average New Zealander is NOT being made aware of this. Justice Collins' interpretation of the Regulations is incorrect as: his basis on the definition of 'medicine' within the meaning of the Act is woefully misguided and would exempt drugs such as Botox (see below) therefore adding fluoridated substances to the public water supply falls within the Act.

#### Furthermore:

- 1. Fluoridated substances such as hydrofluorosilicic acid (HFA) and sodium silico fluoride (SSF) are intended to be ingested and are therefore **not** a water treatment like chlorine
- 2. Fluoridated substances such as hydrofluorosilicic acid (HFA) and sodium silico fluoride (SSF) (Fluoride) are added to the water as treatment for the disease of dental caries therefore it is a medicine. Yet these flouridated substances are not made up to medicine standards, nor have they passed standard medical trials for safety. In fact, these substances are a by-produce of industrial processes which are known to be contaminated with known poisons such as arsenic. Further, unlike medicines, they are not subject to controls as to source and purity China is growing in importance as a source for flouridated substances, which known lax toxicity controls.

It would be a flagrant breach of the Ministry's duty of care to public health and safety to exempt flouridated compounds.

3. The Medicines Act is designed to protect people from the risk of indiscriminate use of medicines, reflecting the ethical codes of health professionals to "first do no harm". The Ministry is aware of the body of evidence from international studies plus the fact that most of the world does not add fluoridated substances to their water supply that the indiscriminate, uncontrolled fluoridation of water is unethical because it is ineffective. The majority of US population drinks fluoridated water, yet 16% of children aged 6-19 present with dental caries, and 24% of adults aged 20-64 present caries. In UK, dental caries occurs around 25% in children and 33% in adults (

http://www.nhs.uk/conditions/dental-decay/Pages/Introduction.aspx). Adding fluoridated substances clearly is failing to work. Broadly, the decline in rates of DMFT (tooth decay) has declined in all developed countries irrespective of whether flouride has been added to water or salt.

From the Ministry's own figures (2012: Age 5 and Year 8 oral health data from the Community Oral Health Service) the case is far from clear cut. The figures support a cautious approach as the differences in DMFT are not sufficiently large to support unequivocally the claim that water fluoridation is a factor in improving dental health of 5 year olds. Furthermore, it is well-established that fluoridation contributes nothing to the health of adult dentition.

The case for topical, controlled fluoridation is therefore an option that should be pursued by the Ministry. To exempt fluoridated substances

4. The proposed amendment removes the safety precaution protecting people from harm thereby undermining the right of every New Zealander to be safe from the indiscriminate use of medicines. It is motivated solely by an industry that would otherwise have to find alternative ways to dump the toxic wastes of their fertiliser and other processes.

Justice David Collins bases his conclusion on the low concentration of fluoride in drinking water, that because the intended concentration is less than 10mg/l it could well be exempt. He is ignorant that, for example, medicines such as Botox are used at concentrations of under 1ng per 100 units. By the reasoning of the learned Judge, botilinum would be also exempt because it is administered at a threshold far lower than that in the Regulations.

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



Happy New Year everyone.

We are starting the new year with a big challenge.

We have only until Friday to contribute to the consultation the Government is undertaking with regard to the Ministry of Health's proposal to exempt fluoridation chemicals, hydrofluorosilicic acid (HFA) and sodium silico fluoride (SSF) from being subject to the Medicines Act. That leaves only tonight and two more days to get a submission in.

We need as many people as possible to put in a submission, no matter how small. All submissions are counted so taking a few minutes to fill out the form and send in is very worthwhile. See <a href="http://fluoridefree.org.nz/urgent-moh-try-exempt-fluoride-chemicals/">http://fluoridefree.org.nz/urgent-moh-try-exempt-fluoride-chemicals/</a> for instructions.

The Ministry of Health claim they are doing this to give clarity, but since we already have a judicial system that is there to provide clarity to the law, there is no need for them to do that. In fact, the Government stepping in and overriding the judicial system whenever it does not suit them is a slippery slope that should concern all New Zealanders. We believe the real reason for this drastic action can only be that the Ministry of Health knows that these chemicals, when used for the purpose of fluoridation, will be considered to be medicines when New Health New Zealand takes the case to the Appeal Court in a few months time.

In October last year, Judge Collins found that HFA and SSF satisfied all the key elements of a medicine in that they are used for a therapeutic purpose and they achieve their intended action on the human body by a pharmacological means. 

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

	Fluoride does not treat drinking water. Fluoride substances are used to treat or prevent tooth decay. Tooth decay is described as a disease. According to the Oxford Dictionary the definition of medicine is:  "A drug or other preparation for the treatment or prevention of disease".  Any chemical intended to treat a disease therefore is deemed to be and must be classified as a medicine.  To make a judgement that it is "only" 1 - 1.5 mg/litre, which is most likely too little to cause any harm, is also misleading and a misconception. 


